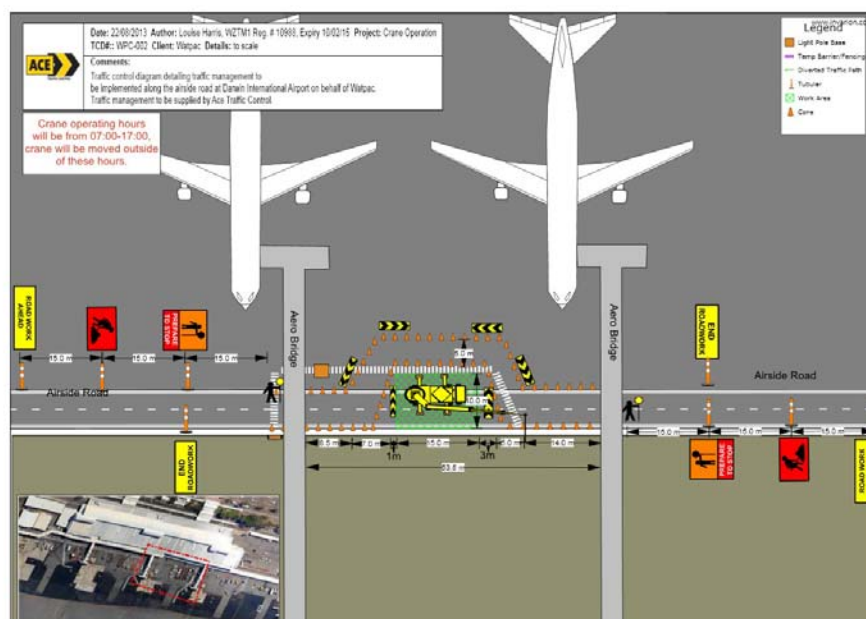

Subject: **Changed Traffic Conditions Airside Road – CRANE OPERATIONS**

Area of Concern: **Airside Operations**

With effect from **Monday 9th Sept to Wednesday 2nd October** there will be changed traffic conditions with the **AIRSIDE ROAD** between Bay 3 and Bay 4. From this date both lanes will be closed between 0700 and 1900 hours to allow for parking of a 55 tonne crane, required for ongoing terminal expansion works in this location. All vehicular traffic will be diverted via a temporary road system, as shown in the diagram below. This road system will require all GSE equipment currently located within the storage bay at this location to be relocated for the period of works.

Traffic management will be in place – their primary purpose is to ensure the safe movement of vehicular traffic through the work site. There may be some minor delays during periods of the day. Pedestrian traffic will take priority, especially with aircraft boarding or disembarking



Road work signage, traffic cones & water filled bollards will be used to mark the airside road and to delineate the works areas and pedestrian crossings.

Traffic Marshalls with **STOP / GO** signs will be used to control traffic.

Drivers must **SLOW DOWN** and obey all instructions by traffic marshallers & signage
Please exercise extreme caution when driving in this area.

- Be mindful of blocking entry to the Baggage Makeup Area, do not queue across the entry area
- Do not use the Apron area as a general shortcut
- Adhere to the designated speed limits
- Please stop well clear of the traffic marshallers at the marked STOP line to allow approaching traffic to exit the lane safely & with sufficient room
- Always give way to traffic on the airside road when exiting the apron area

AT ALL TIMES LOOK OUT FOR PEDESTRIANS WITH THE CHANGED ROAD CONDITIONS

During the hours of 1900 hours and 0700 hours both lanes of the airside road at this location will be available.

Be aware of what is happening around you and observe all speed limits,  on Aprons and as otherwise marked elsewhere.
